

Grampians Easter 2012



The fact that the Grampians were formed from faulted sandstone originally deposited 430 million years ago understates the spectacular range that we see today. This is an area that can be visited repeatedly without becoming monotonous. And it will be visited again during Easter 2012 as an accommodated trip.

The accommodation consists of cabins with bunk-beds at the Asses Ears Wilderness Lodge, with 4 or 5 people allocated per cabin (depending upon exact numbers). Each cabin has its own bathroom & air conditioning.

The 3 main day walks are Mt. Stapleton circuit (medium, approx. 14km), Mt. Rosea circuit (medium, approx. 14km), and the Mt. Difficult - Brigs Bluff - Beehive Falls traverse (16km, medium-hard). An optional 1/2 day walk on the last day will be the Chimney Pots (3hrs). Walks may be changed due to weather, group interest, etc.

Cost of the long weekend (4 nights) is \$124 plus trip fees. This includes a basic breakfast and a spit roast for one of the nights. You will need to bring lunch and snacks. The plan for dinner is for a BBQ on the first night, spit roast on the second night, and a pub meal on the last night.
